Please find enclosed the answer of the queries from your end. We got the format from Dr. Dhanada Mishra on 15th of June, 04 while set for a discussion and replying. As per discussion with Mr. Peter & Dr. Mishra the reply of your queries may be treated as the progress report of Gana Chetana on Project AID for the year July .03 to June , 04.

We have also enclosed our plan for the period July, 04 to June, 05. We hope to do all the progress as per our plan mention in this report.

The community work has been continuing since intervention of Gana Chetana in the area and it will go on the future.

We were in specific needs of 8 staffs salary to do both sustainable programme for Gana Chetana and the community work in the operational villages, so that after 3 years Gana Chetana's sustainability would have been a mile stone as discussed with Mr. Peter in April, 2003, while sitting for a complete plans of Gana Chetana. At present with 5 staffs it is highly strenuous and the sustainability may require another project period of 3 years.

We feel it to intimate all of you at AID and hope you all will understand the practicability of the project and our intension. We have been working without rest and still try for many things good to do with all your support and encouragement.

3. Multi Purpose Pond :

- (i) Currently the pond each own by Gana Chetana. The Pond need to be renovated that needs an expenses of about Rs. 70,000.00 for perfect pisciculture purpose. The pond will harvest about 10 quintals of foil if renovation take place, the minimum income will be Rs. 40,000.00 in a year.
- (ii) This year in the month of June 2004, 12,000 span (fish seed) has been placed in the pond. There is a chance of procuring 2 quintals of fish.
- (iii) We have a plan to go for a small pond for the enlargement fish span which has a good demand in the area and that will earn more income. (About Rs. 10,000/- to Rs. 30,000/-)

1. **Staff Development** : Mohan Mahanta and Sunita Padhi visited SRI (Society for Rural Industrialisation) Ranchi to see the development of pisciculture, Vermi compost, poultry, Duckery, Organic Farming, Fruit tree Orchard, Cane craft, Fruit Preservation, indogeneous roof making through self made asbestos and tile, spinning etc. Resource person or S. Sarkar. Duration July 2003.

Sunita Padhi attended drought management programme, Organised by AFFRO, Bhubaneswar, Place - Jashipur, Mayurbhanja, Resource person Dr. Subas Sahoo, Manata Das, Dr. Srinibasan.

Harekrishna Naik visited HOPE, Bhubaneswar, master trainer on Organic farming, duration 24.12.2003 to 26.12.2003, Resource person Dr. Basanta Bambetkar, Prof. Dr. Radha Mohan.

Sunita Padhi visited HOPE, Bhubaneswar towards training on Fruit PProcessing & Preservation from 12.08.2003 to 14.08.2003. Resource person Mr. Chabirani Sahoo.

2. **Income Generation Programmes :**

- (a) For Gana Chetana - Maximum emphasis will be given for the renovation of the pond for the purpose of pisciculture and that will stand as the main source of income in the long run. Fish seed creation in this small pond will be an additional I.G.P. Variety of seed collection from the vegetable cultivation in the demonstration farm of Gana Chetana would be the second major IGP. The seeds will be sold in the weekly market of nearby places in the banner of GC.

- (b) For Community - At Community level the SHGs will make insence stick which has a good market at Ghatageon and Keonjhar. SHG has been producing spice powder and stitched leaf plate, which has been purchased by the business man from the doorstep of the village.

Community Benefit and Community Involvement :

1. Informal sharing on demonstration farm with the people of different villages is a regular phenomenon of Gana Chetana. No workshop done in a formal way. Our experience says the demonstration farm will be a workshop for the people in future. The work related to seedling, plantation, organic farming, seed collection and pisciculture are a continuous process of the farm.

People of different villages have relationship with Gana Chetana and they visit us formally or informally where by there will be a continuous impact of the demonstration farm. This is the first year of starting the demonstration farm which has not grown to the extend of convincing the people but we hope within a period of three years it will have good impact.

2. People are interested to know the technique and uses of organic farming, with sharing of our experience.
(Learn from the training)

The brick' making of Gana Chetana in the demonstration farm has impact on the people. Few of the people are interested to construct their house with this bricks in the future.

3. At present the sharing of our learning on different schemes where people will earn income is the direct help to the community. The laborers work in the Ashram structure construction gets direct help of financial support of two months.
4. People, who break stones to chips, collect stone, sand and clay got the financial benefit of supporting those Gana Chetana for the structure construction.
5. About 64 SHGs are functioning in active where 720 members are participating in regular basis. The SHGs have saved Rs. 1,89,595.00. They have got a bank loan of Rs. 5,37,400.00. About 22 SHGs has been recognized by Govt. and supported by Bank with a subsidy of Rs. 2,20,000.00.

This is a landmark achievement of Gana Chetana. This programme has been taken up since 1998 without financial support.

N.B. : The total deposit of the SHG has been increased to 60% in the last 6 months.

Annexure on details of SHGs enclosed.

6. In 15 villages 15 nos. of forest protection committee has been actively functioning since 1993. About 1,000 hectores of forestland has been protected. Out of existing forest in these 15 villages about 265 families get an average income of Rs. 3,358.00 per year. The salable NTFP are sala seeds, sala leaf, Mahua flower, Mahua dry, mango, mango juice (dry) and tammarind. The details of NTFP and the price list enclosed in Annexure.
7. In 15 villages 15 nos. of agriculture committees are functioning systematically. Out of these the agriculture committee of villages 1-Dummuria, 2-Talaraidiha, 3-Badakamandra, 4-Sanakamandra, 5-Tentalapasi has been supported with local verity of seeds to give to need agriculturist.

The seed bank has been supported to the above 5 villages on condition that the borrower will refund the seeds in 25% of excess amount. Ultimately there will be a seed bank of large amount of seeds to meet the whole need of the village in the long run. The details of agriculture committee is enclosed in annexure.

8. A survey on uses of bio - diesel project in the villages of Jhumukapasi, Gopinathpur, Badakamandra took place in the month of May 2004. Out of the above villages it seems that people of village Badakamandra are more interested to manage and use the bio - diesel projects.
